Among the Believers charts the personal quest of a firebrand Pakistani cleric whose schools are training thousands of children to take part in jihad (holy war).

SHORT SYNOPSIS

Firebrand cleric Abdul Aziz Ghazi, an ISIS supporter and Taliban ally, is waging jihad against the Pakistani government with the aim of imposing Shariah law. His primary weapon is his expanding network of Islamic seminaries for children as young as four. *Among the Believers* follows Aziz's personal quest, and charts the lives of two of his teenage students who are pawns in his ideological war.

FILM SUMMARY

Charismatic cleric Abdul Aziz Ghazi, an ISIS supporter and Taliban ally, is waging jihad against the Pakistani state. His dream is to impose a strict version of Shariah law throughout the country, as a model for the world. A flashpoint in Aziz's holy war took place in 2007, when the government leveled his flagship mosque to the ground, killing his mother, brother, only son and 150 students. With unprecedented access, *Among the Believers* follows Aziz on his very personal quest to create an Islamic utopia, during the bloodiest period in Pakistan's modern history.

The film also follows the lives of two teenage students who have attended madrassahs (Islamic seminaries) run by Aziz's Red Mosque network. Throughout the film, their paths diverge: Talha, 12, detaches from his moderate Muslim family and decides to become a jihadi preacher. Zarina, also 12, escapes her madrassah and joins a regular school. Over the next few years, Zarina's education is threatened by frequent Taliban attacks on schools like her own.

Aziz's foil is nuclear physicist and leading educational activist Dr. Pervez Hoodbhoy. He passionately opposes Aziz through his public appearances, lectures, and the media. Opposition against Aziz comes to a head in December, 2014, when Aziz insults a grieving nation by trying to justify the brutal massacre of 132 school children in Peshawar by the Taliban. The attack ignites a movement to end extremism in Pakistan's mosques and madrassahs. Led by Hoodbhoy and others, Pakistan's moderate majority focuses on Aziz and calls for his arrest.

Intimate and shocking, *Among the Believers* offers rare insights into the ideological battles shaping Pakistan and the Muslim world.

MORE BACKGROUND ON THE ACCLAIMED FILM & THE CHALLENGES THE FILMMAKERS HAVE FACED

Among the Believers, which premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival last year, offers unprecedented access to Taliban Spokesperson, ISIS ally, and one of Pakistan's most dangerous terrorist -- Cleric Aziz. Following its premiere the filmmakers received a deluge of press/media attention. The film was ranked as one of the top docs of 2015. Among the Believers screened in over 50 film festivals in 25 countries, won 12 awards including an Independent Spirit Award nomination.

Among the Believers has received near-universal critical acclaim. **BBC's Owen Gleibermen** said, "I found it alarming, but most of all I found I illuminating." It received a rare "A" rating from **IndieWire**, which called it "remarkable" and "an intricate and frightening look into the microcosm of our world's biggest international issue."

The Washington Post called "Among the Believers" one of "three films you must see to truly understand Pakistan."

The filmmakers spent five years building relationships with the film's characters, allowing them to gain what **Variety** called "unprecedented access" to Cleric Aziz and two students within his Red Mosque network.

Despite the controversial subject matter, the team worked painstakingly during production and post-production to maintain objectivity, and ultimately created what **Reel News Daily** called a "beautifully balanced" film. **The Wall Street Journal** noted that, "Despite the hot-button nature of their material, the filmmakers strive to keep their tone evenhanded."

Among the Believers offers rare insights into the ideological battles shaping Pakistan and the Muslim world. Because it deals with such inflammatory issues, the film crew has faced very real dangers.

Almost instantly after its release, there was a reaction from militants who were sympathetic to Cleric Aziz, the subject of the film. The film's crew members in Pakistan were slammed with death threats, and several were forced to move houses and go into hiding out of fear for their safety.

Furthermore, Pakistani human right activists- and friends of the filmmakers- Sabeen Mehmud and Khurram Zaki, who spoke out against Cleric Aziz were murdered. To make matters worse the film was banned in Pakistan -- and it is still banned. Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch, The Sundance Institute, Tribeca Film Institute and IDA have currently appealed the Pakistani government to lift the ban.

The filmmakers had to make the collective decision to go into hiatus and not pursue any distribution until all the safety and security issues surrounding the film were resolved.

They finally showed the film to Cleric Aziz just in July 2016, and alleviated his concerns. The film is now set for its theatrical release in September, and it will be available on Netflix, iTunes and Amazon after. First Run Features is distributing the film.

Among the Believers is a cautionary tale for Americans - to show how much harm a bigoted despot

film, which is showing moderate Muslims fighting against extremist radicals and reclaiming their own faith. Furthermore- this is an indigenous film- it is a story of terrorism told by Muslims themselves (the majority of the crew is Muslim).

DIRECTORS' STATEMENTS

Producer/Director Hemal Trivedi

Upon losing a friend in the Mumbai terrorist attacks of 2008, I sought to understand the root cause of these attacks that were carried out by Pakistanis. After careful study, I realized that ordinary Pakistanis are themselves victims rather than perpetrators. The same extremist elements who carried out the attacks in Mumbai are actually terrorizing their own people on a daily basis, and the country's very survival is at stake. I started filming in Pakistan in 2009.

Director Mohammed Ali Naqvi

Like many of the children in our film, reading the Quran was compulsory for me growing up in a religiously conservative Pakistan. And like them, I could read the script and sound out the words, but I had absolutely no idea what I was reading. What I knew of Islam was filtered through maulanas (clerics), and I found their teachings limited and shallow. Ultimately, as a reactionary stance to the ideological force-feeding, I compartmentalized my religious upbringing and made my way to the U.S. for college. It wasn't until I moved to New York right after college – and personally witnessed the 9/11 attacks – that was I forced to face my own religious narrative. Many of my films, for this reason, mirror my own spiritual quest. Among the Believers, for me, will always represent my path to reconnecting with God and a faith that I had abandoned long ago.

Producer/Director/Editor Hemal Trivedi

Hemal has been a Mumbai and New York City-based documentary film editor/director for over a decade. She has edited films that have won three Emmys, One Oscar and seven Emmy nominations. She has won an Emmy for outstanding editing and was nominated for Independent Spirit Award. Her credits include *Outlawed in Pakistan* (Editor, Emmy 2014, PBS Frontline, Sundance); *Saving Face* (Editor, Oscar 2012, Two Emmys 2013, HBO/Channel 4); *Shabeena's Quest* (Director/Editor, Witness, Al Jazeera); *Flying on One Engine* (Editor, SXSW, IDFA); *Laughter* (Editor, BBC); *When the Drum is Beating* (Editor, ITVS, Tribeca 2011); and *Beyond Mumbai* (Director, Camera & Editor, OWN, 2011

Webby nomination). She has produced and edited over 50 award- winning shorts for Odyssey Networks.

Living between Pakistan and New York, Emmy-winning filmmaker Mohammed is a fellow of the National Endowment for the Arts and American Film Institute's Project 20:20 program. His work has received numerous awards, including the Amnesty Human Rights Award, the United Nations Association Festival Grand Jury Award, an Independent Spirit Nomination and has been showcased at the Museum of Modern Art. His documentary credits include *Shame* (Showtime-Toronto, IDFA, Tribeca), *Pakistan's Hidden Shame* (Channel 4, NHK, SVT, Sheffield, UNAFF), *Shabeena's Quest* (Al Jazeera), and *Terror's Children* (Discovery). Mohammed has produced two narrative feature films, *Big*

River and I Will Avenge You lago, starring Giancarlo Esposito and Larry Pine, and recently directed the narrative short Happy Things in Sorrow Times. Mohammed is also the founder of MuNan Pictures, an independent production house which has developed programing for Showtime, Channel 4, NHK, Al Jazeera, SVT, CNN, MTV, Current TV, New York Times Television, and has recently worked with Oprah Winfrey's Harpo Productions.



Producer/Writer Jonathan Goodman Levitt

Jonathan's films as director and/or producer have been supported by BBC, PBS, NHK Japan, and over a dozen other broadcasters. Personally or through his company Changeworx, he has worked on documentary features that follow people for multiple years on five different continents. Jonathan's latest directing project, *Follow the Leader*, was featured on C-Span, CNN and Fox; released by PBS stations and Cinedigm; and was the only documentary to premiere during both the 2012 Republican and Democratic national conventions. His first feature, *Sunny Intervals and Showers* (Director, Producer, Editor, Camera, 2003), screened at multiple festivals, including Sheffield, Chicago and One World; aired as part of the BBC Storyville documentary strand; and was nominated for Grierson (British Documentary) and Mental Health Media Awards. Jonathan was a Fulbright Scholar at the UK's National Film School (NFTS) in 1999. He has been based in Brooklyn since 2008.
